NOTES for Worship Planners

Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed! Much like Mary Magdalene at the tomb, we marvel at the Resurrection. The despair of only a few days ago has disappeared. Jesus has risen from the grave? Yes, he has. And the joy of this moment is contagious! Mary Magdalene shares the news of the resurrected Jesus with the disciples. We, too, must share the news of the Resurrection, the joy of a living and loving God, with everyone around us.

The purple of Lent does not last forever. Easter arrives, dressed in **white and gold**, and with a **flurry of Alleluias**! We celebrate with the disciples that Jesus is alive in a new way, and we move toward Pentecost when we welcome the Holy Spirit.

The experience of Easter and the days that follow are at the same time personal and communal. Jesus has individual encounters with some of his disciples (Mary Magdalene, Thomas) after the Resurrection, but he encourages them – and all of his disciples – to go and share his message of love, justice, and peace with the whole world. As the disciples go about laying the foundation of the early church, Jesus urges them to remember his commandments, gather in unity, and lean on the Holy Spirit as a guide.

Love does not die, Alleluia! Life is continually made new, Alleluia! Signs of Love alive are all around us, Alleluia!

Dressing the Space for Easter

"Alleluia" posters around the church, Butterflies, Easter Lilies, Large stone leaning against the baptismal font or altar, Balloons

Using **gathered stones**, create a reflection space. Pick stones from your backyard, local park or gardens, and assemble them on a plate or placemat or in a basket or small bowl. Let them be a reminder of Jesus' death and resurrection and our call to be living stones and witnesses to the story of love overcoming death. Each week, pick a different stone and carry it with you as a reminder of Resurrection love. Reflect on the ways God might be calling you to be a living stone.

Rising with Christ from the tomb, we are called from death to life, to grace and forgiveness of sin, in the name of the Father, +Son, and Holy Spirit. **AMEN.**

Dramatized reading of the Gospel, John 20:19-31 (based on NRSV)

A narrator and two other readers – Jesus and Thomas – plus the disciples. Review with the congregation that their role in the reading is as the disciples (have the words in the bulletin or projected).

Narrator: It was evening on that day that we call the day of resurrection, the first day of the week. The doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Judeans. Jesus came and stood among them.

Jesus: Peace be with you.

Narrator: After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. *Jesus shows his hands and side to the congregation by holding them out and pointing.* Then the disciples rejoiced.

The Disciples: shout words such as "Praise be to God" "Hallelujah" "Wow" The narrator holds up hands to signal when to stop.

Jesus: Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you. And as I breathe on you, receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.

Narrator: But Thomas, who was called the Twin, one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the disciples told him,

The Disciples: We have seen the Lord!

Thomas: (speaking to the disciples) Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe.

Narrator: A week later, Jesus' disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them.

Jesus : (speaking to the disciples) Peace be with you. (Now speaking to Thomas) Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe. (*Extends hand, gestures to side.*)

Thomas: (speaking to Jesus) My Lord and my God!

Jesus: (speaking to Thomas) Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.

Narrator: Now, Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

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APRIL 26, 2020 - 3rd Sunday of Easter

Today's gospel begins with two disciples walking to Emmaus, overcome with sadness, loss, and disappointment. They had hoped Jesus, who was crucified, would be the one to redeem Israel! Yet the risen Christ walks with them and then opens their eyes in the breaking of the bread. Each Sunday our hearts burn within us as the scriptures are proclaimed and Christ appears to us as bread is broken and wine is poured. The story of Emmaus becomes the pattern of our worship each Lord's day. **Sundays & Seasons, Augsburg Fortress*

Paul reminds us that though we each have different capacities, we are unified in the Spirit that equips us with these gifts. Jesus breathes the Holy Spirit on his disciples, empowering them to forgive sin. We celebrate that we too are given the breath of the Holy Spirit and sent out to proclaim God's redeeming love to all the world. *Sundays & Seasons, Augsburg Fortress

Dressing the space for Pentecost

There are many ways to create the illusion of fire or light coming down from above: long stretches of flame-colored fabrics might be stretched from one side of the worship space to another or hung from the ceiling. Lengths of ribbon might be secured to the center of a ceiling fan so that the ribbons move with the air currents. Another option is to hang wind chimes in places where they are likely to jingle during worship; in open windows or near fans.
