Where Two or Three are Gathered: Worship for Small Assemblies Lent Year C March 6 – April 14, 2019

Planning Notes for Leaders

- Hear, see, and sing the incarnation and resurrection hope in a way that also acknowledged the reality of loss and death. Lent is a time when everything we do in worship reading, music, colors, liturgical arts can remind us simultaneously of the reality of death, the reality of resurrection life, and Jesus' experience of life, death, and resurrection life with us.
 - We come to God in rawness. Choose fabrics which are "raw", with unfinished edges. Try combining old, unmarked, clean sacks, with a strip of purple linen.
 - Use natural items to adorn the space dry tree branches, thorny stalks, tall, dry grasses
 - A bowl with stones, filled with water can remind us of this journey in our baptism.
- Fasting and Feasting Our association with starkness and denial in Lent are contrasted with our lessons in Year C. We hear stories of the joyful father throwing a feast, oil used on Jesus' feet, and manure piled high to coax a tree back to life. Are there ways you can bring alive this fasting and feasting in your worship life? Every Sunday when we receive communion or give thanksgiving for the Word, we are feasting.
- Unlike Good Friday, Palm/Passion Sunday does not end with Jesus' death but with the feast holy communion. Joining together in the Apostles' creed after hearing the Passion reading is a powerful moment where fast and feast come together in a communal statement of faith, which becomes tangible in the meal we share. *The above notes are compiled from Sundays and Seasons, 2019, Year C* © 2018 *Augsburg Fortress, pp. 107-108, and Worship Guidebook for Lent and the Three Days* © 2009, *Augsburg Fortress pp. 62-63.*
- Silence has been included before the reading of the Lessons. Give people the time to calm their body and minds. In the hectic world we live in, sometimes this is the only silence people receive during the week. Treat it as a gift that can be savoured. Are there other places within the service where silence might be appropriate?

<u>Music</u>

Each week the service opens with the same gathering song - "What we need is here." – a reminder that no matter where we are, God is also there. This song and another suggested song during the Second Week in Lent can be led paperlessly. The organization, Music that Makes Community, has videos, which demonstrate how these can be led.
