Planning Notes for Leaders

Introduction

Good Friday and the Easter Vigil

The Triduum or Great Three Days are the principal days of worship of the entire liturgical calendar. On these three days the assembly moves with Jesus through the drama of the passover and last supper meal on Maundy Thursday, to the betrayal, trial and crucifixion on Good Friday, finally to the great joy of the resurrection celebration at the Vigil.

Season of Easter

From Sundays and Seasons

What is Easter anyway? Christians consider Easter to be the "first day." From Easter comes the practice of worshiping on Sunday morning. It is the first day of the week. It is also the first day of new creation, sometimes called the "eighth day" of the week, for on it Christ restored the image of God in the human and in so doing also brought restoration and renewal to all of creation. The Easter season proceeds from and celebrates this first day. In the resurrected Christ, there is time after the end, life after death, restoration of what was broken, the brightening of what had gone dark. In the fifty days of Easter, Christian communities around the world strive to worship God in a way that illustrates that the body of Christ lives now in the heavenly places and also in the gathered body in the world. Worship is where heaven and earth meet.

Season and Lectionary

Good Friday is the middle day of the Triduum or the Great Three Days. Good Friday worship neither begins nor ends. Instead, the service picks up with Psalm 23 from Maundy Thursday the night before and pauses for silent prayer before the cross before resuming at the Great Vigil of Easter. Following the suggested order from Evangelical Worship or a more pared down order in Tenebrae style, breaking up the Passion Reading with hymns is recommended.

The Vigil is the third and climactic day of the Triduum or the Great Three days. The vigil begins after sundown on Holy Saturday around the new fire. There the deacon or cantor sings the exsultet, the Bishop or presider blesses and numbers the new paschal candle for the year and the assembly processes into the worship space to hear the 12 readings from the people of Israel. The readings may be presented in a variety of ways through dramatic reading, dance, art or other creative means. Then the assembly hears again the promises made in baptism and is aspurged with green boughs. Then the resurrection Gospel is proclaimed often followed by the

Easter Homily of St. John of Chrysostom or another appropriate Easter message. The assembly then gathers around the Eucharist Feast to celebrate the resurrection until the first light of dawn. A full Vigil celebration is often not possible, and so parts and pieces of the vigil liturgy are often adapted for use in local congregations. The vigil is good opportunity to join with other congregations and ecumenical partners for worship.

The first 3 Sundays of Easter begin with the celebration of the resurrection on Easter Sunday morning. Each Sunday the gospel lesson returns the assembly to the morning of the resurrection. The early church understood the whole season of Easter to be one great day of celebration spread over 7 weeks. And so Easter Sunday was just the first of a long celebration lasting the entire season.

The second half of the Season of Easter begins on the 4th Sunday of Easter known as Good Shepherd Sunday. While the day continues with the themes and seasonal elements of the first 3 weeks, the attention of the readings turns from recounting the stories of Easter Day to looking ahead to the creation of the new Easter community called the Church on Pentecost.

Seasonal visuals and music

The colour for Good Friday is nothing. No vestments or paraments are used. While black has been used for this day, the association of black with negative or difficult stories in the church connects with negative racial undertones. Besides, as the stripping of the altar on Maundy Thursday, the unadorned chancel and liturgical leaders offer a more striking visual than black colours. The one exception might be to adorn the cross in black cloth to bear the symbol of a burial shroud.

The colour for the Sunday in the season of Easter is white

The hymns of Good Friday should reflect the solemn character of the day and in no case should Easter hymns be sung.

The hymns throughout the season of Easter should be taken from the Easter canon, though selections from other parts of the hymnbook should be added to expand the hymnody of the season.

Seasonal variations on the liturgy

In the opposite of Lent and Advent, it is appropriate to omit the Kyrie during Easter to emphasis the hymn of praise and the celebratory nature the season.

The Nicene Creed is used in Easter.

As a primary Easter theme is our resurrection in the waters of baptism, it is appropriate to use the Thanksgiving for Baptism through the season of Easter.

Resurrection of Our Lord: Vigil of Easter, Year C (Saturday, April 16, 2022)

Introduction

This is the night of salvation!

Through the ages at the Great Vigil of Easter, Christians have gathered around fire, word,

water, bread, and wine; proclaiming through story and song that ours is a God who continuously brings life out of death. On this night we experience again the heart of God's baptismal promise — the center of our faith. We are claimed and cleansed, renewed in the death and resurrection of Christ. We gather with all the saints of every time and place to celebrate the good news: Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!
