Epiphany: to manifest or be revealed

Worship Notes

We will steep ourselves in the wisdom & mind of Christ as we journey alongside Jesus through the Season of Epiphanytide, beginning with the Baptism of our Lord, on Jan,8 through to the Transfiguration of our Lord on Feb.15

Epiphanytide is a season of new beginnings, indeed surprising beginning. The Season after Epiphany is part of Ordinary Time that follows Christmas and precedes Lent (Ordinary Time then picks up again following Pentecost). The length of the season after Epiphany is dependent upon the date of Easter.

Key themes of the season are:

Baptismal Affirmation & Discipleship.....Walking Wet!

Identity, Discipleship, Journeying with Jesus, Wisdom, Healing, & Commitment

Visuals - Highlight the Baptismal font. Visuals could include a Baptismal river (blue cloth) flowing from the baptism font, walking stick, sandals, fish nets, prayer rocks to place along the river bed.

The liturgical color for Jan.8, Baptism of our Lord, and Feb. 19 Transfiguration is white The Sundays in between (Ordinary time) are green.

Other worship notes -

- Consider using Thanksgiving for Baptism in lieu of Confession & Forgiveness (see Pg. 7&8) Invitation to font during children's time, share in marking one another with sign of the cross

Music - Express key themes in music.

- Use a Seasonal Opening song such as:
 - Wash O God Your Sons and Daughters ELW 445 Come to the Water of Life ACS 955 I'm Going on a Journey ELW 446
- Or a Song during Thanksgiving for Baptism/Children's Time...
- Or introduce a new liturgy setting

Theme: Baptismal Identity - both Jesus and us!

Kickoff new liturgy and seasonal elements

Lectionary - Isaiah 42:1-9, Psalm 29, Acts 10:34-43, Gospel Matthew 3:13-17

Prayer of the Day - O God our Father, at the baptism of Jesus you proclaimed him your beloved Son and anointed him with the Holy Spirit. Make all who are baptized into Christ faithful to their calling to be your daughters and sons, and empower us all with your Spirit, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen. (ELW pg.22)

Theme: What's in a Name? Baptism, Discipleship, Journey

Lectionary - Isaiah 49:1-7, Psalm 40:1-11, 1 Corinthians 1:1-9, Gospel John 1:29-42

Prayer of the Day - Holy God, our strength and our redeemer, by your Spirit hold us forever, that through your grace we may worship you and faithfully serve you, follow you and joyfully find you, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Amen. (ELW pg.22)

Lectionary - Isaiah 9:1-4, Psalm 27:1, 4-9, 1 Corinthians 1:10-18, Gospel Matthew 4:12-23

Prayer of the Day - Lord God, your lovingkindness always goes before us and follows after us. Summon us into your light, and direct our steps in the ways of goodness that come through the cross of your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Amen. (ELW pg.23)

Lectionary - Micah 6:1-8, Psalm 15, 1 Corinthians 1:18-31, Gospel Matthew 5:1-12

Prayer of the Day - Holy God, you confound the world's wisdom in giving your kingdom to the lowly and the pure in heart. Give us such a hunger and thirst for justice, and perseverance in striving for peace, that in our words and deeds the world may see the life of your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Amen. (ELW pg.23)

Prayer of the Day - Lord God, with endless mercy you receive the prayers of all who call upon you. By your Spirit show us the things we ought to do, and give us the grace and power to do them, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Amen. (ELW pg.24)

Theme - God's Glory is Revealed in Jesus

- Consider using Burial of Alleluias to foreshadow Easter (see Resource below, pg.8) *"Farewell to Alleluia"*

Lectionary - Exodus 24:12-18, Psalm 2, 2 Peter 1:16-21, Gospel Matthew 17:1-9

Prayer of the Day - O God, in the transfiguration of your Son you confirmed the mysteries of the faith by the witness of Moses and Elijah, and in the voice from the bright cloud declaring Jesus your beloved Son, you foreshadowed our adoption as your children. Make us heirs with Christ of your glory, and bring us to enjoy its fullness, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen. (ELW pg.25)

Thanksgiving for Baptism

In the Lutheran tradition, we often start worship with either Confession and Forgiveness or Thanksgiving for Baptism. I think that any time we can acknowledge our messiness and imperfections in church is good. It is such a relief to start worship knowing I'm in a room full of imperfect people who are also sinners and have also made mistakes. Publicly sharing that together is a great way to start our time with God. It is great to understand how messy we are, how the world hurts us, and that we need God in our lives. Enjoy this liturgy.

P: Blessed be the holy Trinity, + one God,

the fountain of living water,

the rock who gave us birth,

our light and our salvation.

C: Amen.

P: People of God, in the baptismal waters we travel with Christ from death to life. Our past, our sin, our failure, our doubt, and our shame are drowned and gone here.

C: You, O God, wash us clean.

P: Our fear, our confusion, our self-righteousness, our despair -- ALL are washed away by grace.

C: You, O God, wash us clean.

P: Our pride, our hypocrisy, and other people's opinions of us no longer have the power to define us.

C: You, O God, give us new life.

P: The Spirit lives and moves through us now, a great and joyful mystery, so we may bring love and mercy into the world as the body of Christ.

C: You, O God, give us new life.

P: Rejoice that God has claimed us in this baptismal grace, not by our own doing or believing but by God's mercy alone.

C: You, O God, give us new life.

P: And so, as we begin worship, we give thanks to God for the gracious gift of baptism that joins us together in Christ by the Spirit's power. Joined to Christ in the waters of baptism, we are clothed with God's mercy and forgiveness.

We praise you for the gift of new life in Jesus Christ. To you be given honor and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever. **C: Amen.**

Farewell to Alleluia. (By Ben Johnston-Urey)

P I heard a great voice from heaven, saying: Alleluia! Salvation and glory and honor and power be to the Lord our God.

C And again they said: Alleluia!

P From the Mount of Transfiguration the Lord God omnipotent reigns!

C Alleluia!

P They came down in the valley of life where there is a time for all things, a time to laugh, a time to cry, and a time to look at the cross. Jesus said, "If anyone wants to follow me, let one forget oneself, take up one's cross and follow me." Today the church buries its Alleluia until Easter morning when it rises with Christ at his glorious resurrection.

C Until that day when we celebrate Christ's resurrection with joy, we commit our Alleluia to the God who gave it.

P Let us pray. O God you give us reason to praise your name with Alleluia. As we enter a Lenten season to reflect upon our human nature and the way you have given yourself for us, we withhold our Alleluia until we celebrate Easter. We await to be people alive in you. **C Amen.**

P The blessings of God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit be upon us and give us peace. **C Amen!**
