Where Two or Three Are Gathered: Worship for Small Assemblies Easter Year A, April 2023 Easter Sunday – Fourth Sunday of Easter Prepared by Lorraine Reinhardt, BC Synod

Easter – the ongoing celebration of Jesus' resurrection.

## **Worship Notes**

Alleluia! Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia! This is the Day that the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it!

In the Season of Easter we are reminded of the faithfulness of God and the power of God. We tell again the story of Christ's dying and rising, of Christ's teaching, of Christ's love for people – for us.

**Visuals** – The colour for the Easter season is white. A grouping of green plants around the baptismal font reminds us it is a season of living and growing. Potted plants speak to growing in faith, being rooted in Christ. Cut flowers speak to Christ's sacrifice. White fabrics could be hung or draped on the cross, or puddled around the font. Provide white streamers (ribbons, perhaps tied or stapled to short sticks/dowels) for people so they can wave them every time they hear or speak an '*Alleluia*!'. Random bursts of '*Alleluia*!', especially on Easter Sunday, can add to the sense of unexpected joy that the first disciples must have experienced upon finding the tomb empty, and meeting Jesus, newly alive. Display extra candles and tea lights, perhaps creating a grouping of candles and plants and flowers and fabric.

**Leader Preparation** – Leading worship is a kind of theatre. The drama unfolds through the reading, praying, and singing. Know the cue for your lines; anticipate what is coming next in the order of worship. Lead from a place of knowing the whole script, not just your part. Readers of lessons or other text are encouraged to read their script out loud in preparation, to be sure of pronunciations of unusual names or words, and to speak in a way that conveys the meaning of the words to the listeners. Singing leaders are encouraged to sing the hymns and songs and liturgical music several times in the week prior to the service. The preparation of those who lead will help the gathered faithful to hear the Word of God, spoken and sung, instead of having them focus on the uncertainty of leadership.

## **Order of Service**

The Order of Service should reflect the community that gathers for worship. Choose liturgical settings and hymns that are familiar, or new ones that can be introduced by someone who has practiced them ahead of time.

The following orders of service outline the usual pattern as presented in Evangelical Lutheran Worship (ELW). In each of the settings in ELW there are instructions and suggestions given (rubrics) for each part of the service. You will note that some parts of the service may be substituted or omitted. May God grant you inspiration to create a meaningful, Christ-centred worship experience.

Christ be with me, Christ within me, Christ behind me, Christ before me, Christ beside me, Christ to win me, Christ to comfort and restore me. (from ELW 450)
