Where Two or Three Are Gathered: Worship for Small Assemblies Easter Year A, May 7 – June 4, 2023 Fifth Sunday of Easter – Trinity Sunday Prepared by Kathryn Smith, Eastern Synod

Worship Notes

The Easter celebration continues, culminating with the Day of Pentecost on May 28th. We continue to hear lessons of growth and renewal, reflected in the new growth we witness around us in creation – from the fields to the forests, the sea, and the sky. Throughout these next few weeks, we journey through Ascension, Pentecost and into the Season of Pentecost with Trinity Sunday.

During the Easter season, the first reading is from Acts, instead of the Old Testament. What did the early church experience that connects with what is happening in your community or the world today?

Visuals – During the next few weeks, think about how you can keep that initial excitement of the Easter morning alive. *Christ is Risen! Christ is risen, indeed. Alleluia!* If you used green plants around the baptismal font or through your worship area, what are the other colours you could be adding? Are there plants that could be used in the church gardens over the summer months, or seedlings to be used in a community garden, as a reminder of our mission out in the world? Bring red into the worship space for Pentecost using flowers (geraniums might be a natural choice. Use what is available where you live). If you used white streamers during Easter, reuse them by adding in red streamers. Maybe add a third colour for Trinity, helping us to visualize the Three in One.

Leader Preparation – Pentecost is a wonderful time to remind us that the Good News is for **all** people. How many languages do people in your worshiping community speak? Ask people ahead of time to prepare a prayer of intercession, to be read in a language that is not usually used in your worship times. If you have people who are new to your community, maybe they would like to share their story of how they arrived and how the Holy Spirit guided them. During the reading of Acts 2:1-21, possibly after verse 4, have people shout out words of praise in their language of choice. Can you create the chaos that we read about on the first Pentecost day?

Easter is a season of joy. We also acknowledge that our world is not always a joyful place. Feel free to name the hurts, the wars, the injustices, and the needs of your community during your times of prayer. We are a resurrection people, knowing that the living Christ walks with us, even while people and the world continue to need our prayers. The honesty of our prayers allows people to fully declare "Amen."

Music – If you have been using the same liturgy for a while, consider starting using a new one for the Season of Pentecost. If you begin in May by introducing one new element each week, you will have most of it learnt by the summer.

Continue singing Easter hymns for the whole season of Easter. It is always good to sing our Alleluia's. "Loaves were broken, words were spoken" (ACS #966) is an appropriate song to use as an offering song or during communion for the rest of the season.

For Pentecost, consider singing songs with words and music from around the world. A cantor or small choir could learn the words in a different language, as printed in ELW. See hymn suggestions below.

Order of Service

The following Orders of Service follow the usual pattern as outlined in Evangelical Lutheran Worship (ELW). Adapt to meet the needs and usual worship practice of your community. It is appropriate to use the Thanksgiving for Baptism during the Easter season in place of the Confession and Forgiveness, as well as to use the Canticle of Praise

Service of Holy Communion

For use when an ordained pastor or authorized lay minister is presiding. The **bold** items are central elements of the liturgy. The other elements support the shape of Christian worship.
