Where Two or Three Are Gathered Season of Creation ~ Let Justice and Peace Flow and Thanksgiving Sunday September 1 to October 8, 2023

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The following information comes largely from the website for the Season of Creation seasonofcreation.org/resources. You will find worship resources in the Season of Creation 2023 Celebration Guide.pdf. Other resources include Sundays and Seasons.

The Season of Creation is a time to renew our relationship with our Creator and all creation through celebration, conversion, and commitment. It is an annual ecumenical season where we pray and act together as a Christian family for our common home.

The symbol for this Season of Creation is a *Mighty River*. "Listen carefully, I am about to do a new thing, now it will spring forth; will you not be aware of it? I will even put a road in the wilderness, rivers in the desert." Isaiah 43:19

The prophet Amos cries out "But let justice roll on like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream!" Amos 5: 24. And so we are called to join the river of justice and peace, to take up climate and ecological justice, and to speak out with and for communities most impacted by climate injustice and the loss of biodiversity. Just like tributaries come together to form a mighty river, as the people of God, we must work together on behalf of all Creation, as part of that mighty river of peace and justice.

Ideas to celebrate the season of creation

- ~ Hold your worship service outside. To celebrate God's creation fully, it is good, where practical, to take our worship outside a building and to worship in the context of God's creation. Depending on your style of worship and the weather, consider an informal service or brief Eucharist.
- ~ Offering. Ask children and adults to gather symbols from nature and take them to the holy table. These symbols can represent the "fruit of the earth and work of human hands" alongside the bread and wine, and serve as a reminder of the voices of all creation that joins in the feast.
- ~ *Include a moment of silence* to listen to, and wordlessly join in with the song of creation's worship. Or play sounds of water or a river in the place of singing as you come to the table.
- ~ In place of the sermon, divide into groups for a short Bible study.
- ~ Organize a creation walk or pilgrimage. Organize a contemplative walk outside by a local river to meditate on the gift of God's creation and our response to be in deeper communion with all life. Invite your group to study ecologically themed Scriptures, or pray with ecologically themed prayers while walking. Your pilgrimage could also culminate in a prayer service.
- ~ *Incorporate the symbol of a mighty river in your worship space.* You can find helpful ideas for activities and crafts with the symbol of a mighty river for your Season of Creation preparation journey which you are welcome to use and adapt as you see fit you can find them in details

at the end of the Celebration Guide (mentioned above). These ideas on how to incorporate the mighty river symbol are also invitations to engage your faith community and reflect on how the symbol this year inspires unity and action for justice and peace.

~ Prepare a bowl of water and frond for sprinkling the congregation.

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The following order of worship is one possible way to proceed. You may choose to use all of these suggestions or only some of them. You may also choose a different order that suits your community. Some possibilities are Service of the Word ELW p. 210, or Morning Prayer ELW p. 298. Hymn suggestions are from Evangelical Lutheran Worship (ELW) and All Creation Sings (ACS).
