#### January 11 – Baptism of our Lord

Following the Epiphany of our Lord on January 6<sup>th</sup>, the Church turns its attention to the season after Epiphany which is 5 weeks long. Within the Season After Epiphany we host two festival Sundays, The Baptism of Our Lord, and concluding with the Transfiguration of our Lord, ahead of the Season of Lent.

#### **Dressing your worship space**

Color for Baptism of our Lord is White
Use white paraments
The Paschal Candle is lit for this festival Sunday

#### Children's message

Props – a Small bowl of water or a baptismal shell

Talking about something very special that happened to Jesus—and something special that happens for us too.

Ask children if they remember their baptisms or what happens in baptism? (Wait for answers—some may say "water," "church," "God," etc.)

Baptism is when we use water to show that someone belongs to God. In today's story, Jesus goes into the water to be baptized by his cousin John. And when Jesus comes up out of the water, something amazing happens. The skies open up, and God's voice says: "You are my beloved child. I'm so pleased with you!"

God looks at Jesus and says, "I love you. I'm so glad you're mine." and that's what God says to each one of us too. When we were baptized—or even if we haven't been yet—God still loves you just the same. God says to us: "You are my beloved child. I'm so pleased with you!"

So whenever you see water—when you wash your hands, take a bath, or play in the rain—we can remember that we belong to God, and that God's love is with us always.

#### Offer a prayer:

Loving God, thank you for loving us just like you love Jesus. Help us to remember that we are your beloved children, no matter what. Amen.

**Thanksgiving for Baptism** – can use Thanksgiving at the Font, pg.10 or 59 (option B or D) ACS for the Call to Worship. Follow the Thanksgiving for Baptism with a Baptismal Hymn, and sprinkle the congregation with water as the hymn is sung.

## Great Thanksgiving for Baptism of our Lord & Season after Epiphany

L: The Lord be with you.

All: And also with you.

L: Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them to the Lord.

L: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

P: It is truly right and our greatest joy to give you thanks and praise, God of majesty and splendour. By your power you created all that is, making a universe out of chaos, and ruling over all things in love. Throughout the ages you called your people to serve you, and to be your light among the nations. When we failed you, you did not fail us and sent prophets to call us back to your ways. We praise you that in the fullness of time, you revealed your love by sending your Son Jesus to be the Light of the world. He came to heal our brokenness and to set before us the ways of justice and peace. Therefore, we praise you, joining our voices with the choirs of angels, and with all the faithful of every time and place, who forever sing to the glory of your name:

C: Holy, holy, holy Lord
God of power & might
Heaven and earth are full of your glory
Hosanna in the highest!

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord Hosanna in the highest Hosanna in the highest.

P: You are holy, O God of majesty, and blessed is Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord. He was born to dwell among us, full of grace and truth; in him we have seen your glory. Baptized by John in the Jordan, he loved you, spoke your truth, showed your love, and gave himself for others. In his death on the cross, he overcame death. Rising from the tomb, he raised us to eternal life and made with us a new covenant by water and the Spirit.

We give you thanks that on the night Jesus ate with his disciples, before his death, He took bread, and gave thanks;
Broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying:
Take and eat; this is my body, given for you.
Do this for the remembrance of me.
Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying:
This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin.
Do this in remembrance of me.

P: Remembering your gracious acts in Jesus Christ, we take from your creation this bread and this wine and joyfully celebrate his dying and rising, as we await the day of his coming. With thanksgiving we offer our very selves to you to be a holy and living sacrifice, dedicated for your service. Great is the mystery of faith:

All: Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

P: Gracious God, pour out your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these gifts of bread and wine, that the bread we break and the cup we bless may be the communion of our love poured out for us. By your Spirit make us one with Christ, that we may be one with all who share this feast, united in ministry in every place.

P: Illumine our hearts, O God, with the radiance of Christ's presence, that our lives may show forth his love in this weary world. Teach us to befriend the lost, to serve the poor, to reconcile our enemies, and to love our neighbours. Keep us faithful in your service until Christ comes again and we shall feast with all your saints in the joy of your eternal realm. Through your Son Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit in your holy Church. All honour and glory are yours, now and forever.

All: Amen

#### A Thanksgiving for Baptism would be appropriate for this Sunday

#### **Eucharistic Prayer**

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Blessed are you, holy God, maker of heaven and earth, source of light and life.

In the dazzling brightness of your Son, you reveal your glory and grace.

From the mountain of Sinai to the mount of Transfiguration, you speak through law and prophets, but now you speak most clearly in Jesus Christ— your beloved Son, the radiance of your presence. He healed the sick, welcomed the outcast, and called us to follow him into the way of compassion, justice, and peace. On the mountain, his glory was revealed—and in the cross, so was your love.

And so, with Mary and Moses, Elijah and Peter, with all the saints of light and all the company of heaven, we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,

heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

Holy God,

before he went down from the mountain,
Jesus turned his face toward Jerusalem.
On the night he ate with his friends before his death,
our Lord Jesus took bread, gave thanks,
broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying:
Take and eat; this is my body, given for you.
Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying:
This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin.
Do this for the remembrance of me.

We proclaim the mystery of faith: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Send now your Holy Spirit, that we who share in this meal may be transformed by your grace— shining with Christ's light in all we say and do. Unite us with all who are gathered around your table, that your church may reflect your glory until Christ comes again in radiant splendour. Through Christ, with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honour are yours, almighty God, now and forever.
